"Jehovah Jireh" (God Our Provider)

³ And Abraham looked up and saw a ram, caught in a thicket by its horns. Abraham went and took the ram and offered it up as a burnt offering instead of his son. ¹⁴ So Abraham called that place "The LORD will provide" as it is said to this day, "On the mount of the LORD it shall be provided."

-Genesis 22:13-14-

Beginning April, I would like to write articles on the Hebrew Name of for God.

In the Old Testament, the Hebrew name for God, YAHWEH, is also compounded with other names giving us beautiful pictures of God's nature and character. He is called *Jehovah Elohim* (Jehovah God), *Jehovah Jireh* (God Our Provider), *Jehovah Rapha* (God Our Healer), *Jehovah Shalom* (God Our Peace), *Jehovah Ra-ah* (God Our Shepherd), *Jehovah Shammah* (God, the One Present), among many others.

Do you remember the story of a father who was asked by God to sacrifice his son on Mount Moriah? His name was Abraham and his son was Isaac. Abraham's account reads. "then God said, 'Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and... sacrifice him there as burnt offering..." (Genesis 22:2).

With trembling heart, Abraham obeyed, but God provided the sacrifice. "Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horn. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as burnt offering instead of his son. So Abraham called the place THE LORD WILL PROVIDE" (Genesis 22:13-14). The phrase we translate "The LORD will provide" is *Jehovah Jireh* or "God Our Provider."

Have you discovered that God still provides for His children? Have you learned that God's provision is enough to meet the needs of your life and that He will be with you when you go through tough times?

The psalmist presented the challenge: "Taste and see that the LORD s good; blessed is the man who takes refuge in him" (Psalm 34:8). You can prove for yourself that the same One who provided a ram in the thicket for Abraham can provide for you today.



Gladbrook United Methodist Trustee Minutes

March 20, 2022

President Paul Koester called the Trustee meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. Members present include Phil Koester, Mark Lowry, Mark Knaack, Keith Sash and Cathy Gethmann.

The minutes of the last meeting were reviewed.

The Treasurer report included past paid bills of:

Church boiler repair \$8,743.45,

Nagle sign replaced 6 bars under warranty but labor and mileage was \$385.20.

An outstanding bill not paid is the replacement hot water heater at the parsonage.

Current balance is \$27,288.50 which includes two estate \$\$ with the use of interest only.

NEW / OLD BUSINESS ITEMS:

Elect of Officers: Motion was made by Phil and seconded by Mark to elect the current officers of President Paul Koester, Vice President Mark Lowry and Secretary Cathy Gethmann.

Motion passed. A question was presented as to whom of the current Trustees would have an upcoming terms expired. No one was able to answer, as this information has not been presented for several years.

SOUND SYSTEM: continues to move forward as we wait. This project will be paid with Memorial funds.

FURNACE INSPECTION: with the boiler repair, a furnace inspection came about. This area needs to be de-cluttered before September. Assistance will be needed in this area. A few items will be relocated and several items will be removed. A floor support pole was added to this area. There have been a few issues with the thermostats in the basement area. A compressor belt was replaced and this will be watched. If there is an issue of the church being overly warm, please let someone know ASAP. We don't need the furnace running non-stop.

LIGHTS: A friendly reminder if you leave an area, **please turns the lights off**. We are finding lights left on overnight and lights left on when no one is in the area. This does not help our increasing utility bill, so please help turn off a light when not in use. Thank you!

Carpet/ Tile Cleaning: We appreciate that Marilyn Brekke has donated money for the fellowship carpet to be cleaned this year. Cathy will contact Rainbow (Conrad/ Beaman) to clean carpets, wax the main hallway and possibly wax the kitchen floor, if UMW wants to support that project again.

SPRING CLEAN UP: Saturday, April 2nd with the rain date: April 9th. Please bring your own equipment and start between 8-9 and be done before noon. Coffee and goodies will be available. Tree removal will happen when it works best for our volunteers with the corner trees on the southeast and southwest being removed.

Chairperson Lisa called the meeting to order. Carolyn provided our devotional. The past minutes were approved. Thank you to Susan B for taking notes in Dana's absence in January. It was much appreciated.

Susan provided the Treasurer's report. Apportionments money has been set aside in the savings account until we decide the future of our church. Contributions have been holding steady. Sharefaith fees have risen to a point that it is no longer wise for us to carry this service for the few people who use it. Grant motioned we discontinue this service. Linda gave the second. Motion approved.

Memorial, **Roger L**. – Audit is underway at this time.

Good Samaritan, Dana— One family is asking for gas money. Husband has been sick and is now out of work. Wife is working part time. Gideon and Dana will work with the family to provide what services we can.

Pastoral Report, Gideon – Gideon reported he made 2 worship services at Westbrook Acres, 1 worship service with Philopena group. He lead 1 Lenten study. He plans to have a Lenten Study every Wednesday until April 13. He's been meeting with the youth group at least once a month. He made 2 hospital visits, drove one person to the hospital and attended several ministerial meetings and 2 conferences this month. He discussed the General Conference of 2022 probably being postponed again until 2024 because Visas are not readily available to foreign visitors because of the pandemic. He discussed the Council of Bishops redirecting money from missionary funds to be put into the Episcopal Fund that pays the bishops' salaries. COLLECTORS AND DESIGNERS WANTED


